Elks National Foundation Final Report June 2006 Lodge Year April 1, 2005-March 31, 2006

I am very pleased to announce that Our State Association came in 5th in the nation at \$8.406 per capita with total donations of \$209,545.98. This is an increase of \$.30 per capita and an increase of over \$9,000 in total contributions from last year. We should be very proud of our continued support to ENF. Below are the results of our lodges' donations. 19 of our lodges exceeded the State President's goal of \$9.00 per member. A total of 33 lodges exceeded the Grand Exalted Ruler's goal of \$4.00 per member. This is an increase of 4 lodges meeting the GER goal. I would like to congratulate Prince Georges County Lodge No. 1778 for being our top per capita winner at \$29.027 per capita. I would also like to congratulate Frederick Lodge No. 684 for winning the Chairman's Challenge with a score of 54.472 and for having the highest amount of money contributed with a total amount of \$19,928.00

DID YOU KNOW?

"MYSTERY"

In 1959 a donation was given to put two plaques and a gate at the entrance of Elks Camp Barrett. At the time the entrance pillars had not been constructed. Approximately 9 years later we contracted a brick layer to build 2 brick pillars, one on each side of the entrance driveway. A brother from Lodge No. 1778 who was in the iron work business built a gate for the entrance.

The plaques were made and given to the Building Chairman, Kenny Largent, to install. He put lags in the wall and 6 inch brass screws. The heavy solid brass plaques were hung. Within 6 months the plaques were stolen.

Several years later a farmer near our camp was plowing his field and hit one of the plaques. He brought it to the camp and gave it to the caretaker. It was then installed on the side of the Dining Hall. The other plaque is still missing.

In 1990 the pillars were extended to be approximately 8 feet higher and the addition of a wooden beam was installed over the entrance at the gate. The name of the camp, "Elks Camp Barrett", is on the beam.

First, I want to say "Thank you" to the members of the North Central District for giving me this wonderful opportunity to serve them for the past year.


Next, I also want to thank our State President, Lee Davis. Your guidance and consul has been greatly appreciated.


