

The U.S had no official flag during the early years of the Revolutionary War, and troops carried flags of different designs-with different colors-into battles.

Finally, on June 14, 1907, the Continental Congress passed a resolution authorizing the red, white and blue flag with stars and stripes as the official flag of the United States. A later resolution said the colors were chosen to designate:

- Red for hardness and courage
- White for purity and innocence
- Blue for vigilance, perseverance and justice

MANSFIELD RECEIVES AWARD

DFC Melanie Mansfield receives the Enrique S. Camarena Award from Salisbury Elks Past Exalted Ruler Rick Konrad.

On Jan. 5, 2010 Deputy First Class Melanie Mansfield of the Wicomico Sheriff's Dept. was presented with the Enrique S. Camarena Award from the Maryland, Delaware and District of Columbia Association. This award was named after Enrique S. Camarena, a Drug Enforcement Administration Agent who was tortured and murdered by drug traffickers in Mexico in 1985.

Prior to serving with the DEA, Agent Camarena was a firefighter, a criminal investigator and a narcotics officer. He believed one person could make a difference. His sacrifice serves as a catalyst to encourage others to make a visable commitment to eradicating drug abuse from our homes, schools, communities and nation.

Each year, the Maryland, Delaware and District of Columbia Elks State Association presents this award to a member of Maryland law enforcement who best exemplifies the qualities and principles for which Agent Camarena gave his life.

DFC Mansfield works in drug court helping with the enforcement part of this problem. Her work helps to provide a deterrent for those people with drug problems from falling back in to the downward spiral of drug abuse and crime. She is also involved with helping families cope with the difficulties arising from these problems.

This is the first time a Wicomico County law enforcement officer has won this prestigious award.
