Hopefully, this message finds you and your Lodges all well and finally beginning to navigate your way back to the "normal" we've all missed and not been able to experience for at least 14-15 months. With more and more folks receiving the Covid-19 vaccine every day and restrictions steadily being lifted, our individual and Elk lives are slowly taking a definite turn for the better and opening up the opportunity to get back to that "normal" the Elks need so much.

For the past couple of months, we have all been experiencing this slow and deliberate move back to where we were some 14-15 months ago. It's not been easy and not without a good bit of anxiety and indecision among many of our Elk family, our non-Elk friends, as well as the local communities, etc.

Over those last 14-15 months, we learned new ways to keep our Lodges viable and alive. To comply with the restrictions in place and keep our fellow Elks safe, we've become used to conducting business from afar using Zoom and other digital and communication platforms. Still, I might add, not always in strict compliance with Elk Statutory requirements. Please also note no one, or no Lodge, has been or will be cited for any Statutory non-compliance in how they had to conduct business to survive these past 14-15 months.

I am happy to say that, for the most part, it appears that our Lodges have come through this pandemic in a relatively good

fashion. There are some negatives, and there is much work to be done in almost every Lodge, but the fact remains there has been much good work accomplished over the past 14-15 months and our 37 Lodges are still alive, kicking, and in pretty good condition considering. My sincere thank you to each and every MD DE & DC Elk who helped in any way for their individual Lodge, our Association, our Order to persevere and survive this pandemic – because of your individual and collective efforts, we will be a better Order of Elks moving forward.

I am also happy and excited to say it is time for the Elks - our Association, our Lodges, and our Order to get back to normal operations. While we now have some new tools and Zoom meetings may still be helpful in certain situations, it's time that all Lodges conduct in-person meetings – Trustees, Board of Directors, Governing Bodies, and general meetings including the membership. Budgets need to be approved on the Lodge floor, and business decisions need to be brought to the floor for a vote – Business must be conducted according to Statutory requirements. It's time we truly get back to "normal" and get back to doing things the Elks way.

Your Association started doing just that back in March with the successful Spring Conference and GER visit held at Cape Henlopen Lodge #2540 (the first in-person meeting since October 2019). While COVID-19 social distancing, wearing masks, and other restrictions were still in place, we had 136 members/34 Lodges present for the meetings and social events of the weekend – about 80% of our regular March Conference attendance. The entire weekend went very well, with two dinners at other Lodges, and a luncheon at Elks Camp Barrett.

ELKS NATIONAL VETERAN SERVICE MISSION

On behalf of the Elks National Veteran Service Commission of the MD, DE & DC Elks Association, I would like to welcome everyone to our State Convention in Solomons Island, MD, In closing, I extend congratulations to all of the incoming State located on the beautiful Chesapeake Bay. Who knew two years Officers for the year 2021-2022. ago when we last met here that the MD DE & DC State Association Convention and the National Convention for the year 2020-2021 would be canceled due to the worldwide Covid-19 pandemic? Thankfully, we are beginning to see an end to this terrible pandemic, and we can come together once again to continue the works of our great organization.

Our Voluntary Service Reps have stayed in touch with the Voluntary Service Directors at their assigned facilities by attending online teleconferences or through Zoom meetings. Our Reps have provided financial support through donations to many of the facilities in support of the Recreational Therapy Programs, Holiday Gift Cards, and Canteen Coupons. The Wilmington VA received a Jukebox for the residents living in the Community Living Center, enabling them to download and listen to their favorite music. The music therapy relaxes them and relieves some of the loneliness and isolation that our sheltered veterans have experienced while they were unable to visit with family and friends due to the pandemic. Some VA facilities are beginning to slowly open up and allowing volunteers and family members to visit with the veterans, but they must have proof that they have received both the COVID-19 vaccine shots and a flu shot before visitation.

The Army of Hope continues to receive requests for financial assistance from the HUD-VASH social workers in the Delaware and Washington, DC area. These requests are usually for security deposits, rent and/or assistance with utility bills. Most recently, the Army of Hope partnered with Delaware Veteran Services and shared the expense of replacing a home heating and air conditioning unit for a veteran living without heat this past winter.

The Welcome Home Project receives requests for assistance from the HUD-VASH social workers looking for veteran assistance with security deposits, furniture, and Welcome Home Kits. This year, the Welcome Home Project provided start-up furniture for ten homeless veterans transitioning into HUD-VASH housing. The ENVSC has expanded the Welcome Home Project to 10 cities across the country. The ENVSC/ Welcome Home Project has also increased reimbursement for Welcome Home Kits from \$200.00 to \$300.00 and to \$500.00 if bedding is provided. For Welcome Home Kit information and reimbursement, go to www.elks.org/vets.

At the Spring Conference in March, the Army of Hope/ Welcome Home Project kicked off our current Car Raffle for the 1975 Mercedes. The funds derived from the car raffle will hopefully provide the funds needed to continue to assist our veterans. Please refer to the Flyer for information concerning the raffle. Online ticket sales will soon be available for purchase

through PayPal. I want to thank and recognize the following Lodges for donations the Army of Hope received at the Spring Conference: Kent Island Lodge #2576, Newark Lodge #2281, and Wilmington Lodge #307.

Congratulations to the following Lodges that received the Freedom Grant for this year: Newark Lodge #2281, Easton Lodge #1622, Abingdon Lodge #2354, St. Mary's County Lodge #2092, Westminster Lodge #2277, and Calvert Lodge #2620.



We need to take time to discuss a real threat to our Lodges and their members; internet hoaxes and hackers. Our State Web page has recently been used in a hoax to get our members to give up their personal information. Please take the utmost precautions to protect yourself. Most Elks know the procedures of membership dues, lapsation, and delinquency. These communications go through CLMS to the State and

Grand Lodge, a very "tried and true" method of information exchange.

Remember, always inspect your email accounts and make sure you do not open anything suspicious. Hackers will always ask you for money. Inspect any social media accounts you have and beware of friend requests or websites suggested by people you do not know. Protect yourself and your info. Change your passwords, secure your computer, and be very cautious while surfing the web.

Here are the latest Grand Lodge Safety tips for you to inspect:

BEWARE OF SCAMS

Scam artists always follow the money, so look out for the following:

- Deposit cash in the bank promptly, do not wait until the next day
- Government agencies/Law Enforcement never ask anyone for cash
- Do not provide anyone with bank account information -IRS always makes its first contact by U.S. Mail, not by telephone or e-mail
- The IRS never requests Not For Profits to make special payments - Someone "in need" asks for cash since they heard that the Elks do good deeds
- An unsolicited "free" inspection of the roof or crawlspace will result in an unnecessary repair bill
- Make sure that you know the sender of an e-mail before you open it to avoid cyber scams
