

What is Camp Like?

While at the Elks Camp Barrett, the campers are divided into individual groups with their own cabins. The activities are supervised by camp counselors, which ensures more personal care. Boys and girls attend on different weeks, with an additional week for co-ed campers. All have access to the same traditional and unique camp programs. (For those new to residential camping, you have the option to return home in the evenings.)

Meals are carefully prepared to be tasty and nutritious and served in a family setting.

Health staff are always on the property or on -call. Campers are encouraged to participate in camp activities and have plenty of opportunities to develop friendships and enjoy the quiet beauty of nature.

All Camp programs are conducted with concern for the campers' needs and safety. Every camp activity is performed with respect for the environment, and campers are encouraged to be good earth stewards.

What is Elks Camp Barrett?

Elks Camp Barrett is an American Camp Association-accredited camp designed to help young people from all backgrounds develop and grow by affording the opportunity to get outdoors for adventure and fun. It is operated by the Elks Association of Maryland, Delaware, and the District of Columbia. Local Elks Lodges sponsor campers and all or a portion of the cost of the camp is covered by that sponsorship.

Who may attend Camp?

Elks Camp Barrett is a camp for everyone between the ages of 9 and 13 (or who completed 3rd grade) from the Maryland, Delaware, or Washington, D.C. area is eligible. They do not have to be needy but should be worthy and deserving or one who would not otherwise have such an opportunity for a camping experience.

How do you apply for Camp Barrett?


