#### FINISH STRONG WITH ELKS PROGRAMS ENF CONTRIBUTIONS

The Elks year is winding down, but now is not the time to sit back and relax and ride the wave to the finish line. You still have time to complete some unfinished projects and make subtle adjustments to finish strong.

All of the various programs and awards for your Lodge and Members are due this month. Take some time to review Elks programs on elks.org to see what awards and certificates of achievement you can give to your Members. One great program is the Contest 'A' - All American Lodge Contest. Although you may believe your Lodge does not qualify for this award, you should still submit the application to see where your Lodge stands and where you can make improvements next year to continue "Meeting the Challenge."

This is also the deadline for all yearly contributions to Elks National Foundation. I know your Lodge has met or is close to meeting the \$4.80 per Member goal. There are also many ENF awards and certificates for your Lodge and Members. These should be applied for and given out. ENF provides money to your State Association, as well as funding many grant programs for your community activities. The most common recommendation from your Grand Lodge Area Auditor is for Lodges to better use the ENF grants to help improve operations. Most programs funded by your Lodge could be funded by ENF, which creates even more opportunities for your Lodge to have a greater impact.

Membership growth has been the number one priority. Our efforts to grow membership at the individual Lodge level and across our Association have been outstanding throughout the year. Our numbers are steadily improving after losing 659 members in 2020/2021. With about five weeks to go, across our 37 Lodges, we already have added 1,431 members, with 1,321 delinquents giving us, at this point, a net gain of 110 members. However, we will likely reduce the 1,321 delinquency

Diane and I attended the State Training sessions and were happy to see the



Should you not be familiar with the William J .Jernick Memorial Fund, it was established in 1982 to honor our deceased Grand Lodge Sponsor. This was set up on a one-time basis to help families with deserving children, 21 years old and under, who are facing medical illness or disease. Upon application and approval by the Board of Directors, Grants are given freely and without obligation for repayment at any time. Special consideration is given to applicants who have no insurance or other means to help

Each year the Board of Directors allocates the previous year's earnings for distribution among five districts within the State Association and to support one week of camping for children with special needs at Elks Camp Barrett in Crownsville, MD. The principal donations are never allocated and continue to grow as tax-deductible donations are received year after year.

Each State District has a chairperson who receives requests from the Lodge chairperson, then forwards the request to the State Chairperson for submittal to the Board of Directors. The individual Lodges also donate thru fundraisers and the like, more money to aid the family in need of assistance.

Now that you are reminded of the procedure, use this fund to make a difference in the care of a child. Check the State website for further information or the State Directory. We are here to help make a difference and do not hesitate to contact one of the chairpersons to assist in this wonderful venture of MD, DE, & DC Elks Association.

During the past few months, we have not received a lot of requests for assistance. The Jernick Fund is here for the use of all Elks in our State Association to help those families with children whose quality of life might be improved by this one-time monetary grant.

Welcome, all, to the Spring conference. Welcome to our Grand Exalted Ruler and First Lady. It is good to spend some time with our friends we see just a few times per year.

As I write this in mid-February, we are very close to achieving a gain in membership for the year. In my presentation at the conference, I hope to report that we have reached this goal. Also, as I write this, I am happy that my Lodge uses the billing program. As Lodge Secretary, I have only had to make sure member addresses are correct and send a few billing notices to those folks who were slow to update their information. Most of the billing notices have been completed for me with this program, with significant financial savings for my Lodge.

Here are some numbers to consider as of mid-February. We started the

year with 19,196 members; we currently have 20,563. We also have 433 candidates awaiting initiation. We need a concerted effort to complete as many initiations as possible before the end of March. Initiate, Initiate, Initiate!!!

membership committee Lodge chairs can use the many online resources in the membership toolkit on the Grand Lodge website. I encourage all Lodge Officers to review this part of the Grand Lodge website. We can get a good start with these resources, but there is no substitute for an active membership committee. Lodge Secretaries, you can give "read" access to CLMS to your Lodge membership chairs, making it easier for them to stay current on who needs to be contacted.

Grand Lodge has a goal, for each State to add 10% of its starting

number as new members. For MD, DE, & DC, this would mean adding 1,920 new members. Just short of the end of the Lodge year, we have added 1,649. We are at 85% of that goal. If we can initiate all our pending candidates, we will exceed the objective. My report at this conference will have up-to-date numbers.

Congratulations are in order for our leaders in recruitment and initiations. Frederick Lodge leads the pack with 164 initiations already. Cape Henlopen and Ocean City are close behind, with 157 and 140 initiations, respectively. These are numbers, and keep recruiting! Many Lodges are also getting reinstatements and transfers, easy additions. These folks are already Elks. As we all know, these numbers will change before we meet; I will endeavor to be accurate at that time.



 Now that life is returning to normal, there will be more calls for DAP displays at schools, parades, and fairs. Keep in mind every district has a DAP Display Kit that holds a 10X10 logo canopy, folding table with logo tablecloth, folding chairs, and display rack. Contact your District Chairperson to reserve the kit for your next DAP event. Don't forget to invite Elroy, the ELKS DAP Mascot, to your next DAP event. We have three Elroy costumes in the State Association that can be reserved. Call your District Chairperson.

- We've reordered the plastic giveaway bags in bulk to save money. They have finally arrived and are ready to be distributed. Every Lodge will receive 250 bags at no cost and may purchase additional bags in packs of 250 bags for \$47.50 per pack (that's only \$.19 a bag!). The bags are being stored at the camp, and pick up or drop off may be arranged by calling Angela or your district DAP chairperson.
- ONE PILL CAN KILL is a joint DEA and DOJ program introduced in October. The program is designed to raise awareness about the increased amounts of counterfeit pills coming across our borders. Most of

these pills are designed to look like opioids and other commonly prescribed and misused drugs. These fake pills are often laced with fentanyl or methamphetamines. 4 out of 10 counterfeit pills seized contain lethal doses of fentanyl.

## **ACCIDENT PREVENTION REPORT**

"Don't become Lodge Mayhem like Me."

Welcome to Frederick, Maryland, and our 2022 Spring Conference! The Wild West!

Now's the time to reflect on the accomplishments of last year and to start planning for the 2022/2023 Elk year. One of, if not the most important, plan you'll have to make is the defense of your Lodge. What am I talking about, you ask? How are you going to protect your Lodge from lawsuits and Lodge Mayhem?

You will be changing committee personnel and Officers; they need to be brought up to speed on making the Lodge safe and, more importantly, how to file an accident report.

At this Spring Conference I will be speaking about:

- !. Liquor Liability Questionnaire
- 2. How to fill out accident/incident reports
- 3. Lodge monthly safety reports

Again, we are Elks, and we assume and expect to see the good in people. Remember, your Lodge is a company and could be subjected to lawsuits. It's imperative that we take the monthly safety reports seriously and immediately address any issues. Review the procedures in filling out incident reports and accident reports. We will be going over this during the meeting, and I'll also give you some other ways to help protect your Lodge. I am available to speak at your Lodge if needed or write up something to present. With that being said, I will leave you with some safety tips. Stay safe and be careful.

#### **LODGE RENTAL AGREEMENTS**

The following should be included in all rental agreements:

- Follow pages 10-11 of the Liability Insurance Program
- Require a certificate of insurance naming the Lodge as additional insured.
- Include a provision for an indemnity agreement.
- Describe the area to be rented, indicate any restrictions on use.
- Indicate any limitations regarding capacity.
- State all rental fees and a clearly defined cancellation policy.
- Verify with the proper authority that the Lodge's liquor license allows service of alcohol to non-Members.
- Service of alcohol must be controlled by the Lodge, no outside alcohol is allowed.
- Self-service of alcohol and self-service kegs are not allowed.
- The Lodge will reserve the right to refuse service to anyone at the discretion of the servers.
- The renter's clean-up responsibilities/requirements should be clearly indicated.
- The Lodge must not sign an agreement assuming responsibility for hired security personnel.
- The Lodge has the right to stop inappropriate behavior.
- The Lodge has the right to shut down the event.
- Consider having an attorney review the rental agreement.



#### **FACILITY RENTAL POLICIES**

Anyone using Lodge facilities must provide an Additional Insured Certificate that names the Lodge as an additional insured.

If the Additional Insured Certificate is not provided, Facility Rental Policies may be obtained by contacting Gallagher

Insurance at (800) 421-3557. Facility Rental policies are also available on the Elks website or the Safety Insurance page.

#### **BEWARE OF SCAMS**

Scam artists always follow the money, so look out for the following:

- Deposit cash in the bank promptly, do not wait until the next day
- Government agencies/Law Enforcement never ask anyone for cash
- Do not provide anyone with bank account information
- IRS always makes its first contact by U.S. Mail, not by telephone or e-mail
- The IRS never requests Not For Profits to make special payments
- Someone "in need" asks for plane fare and cash since they heard that the Elks do good deeds
- An unsolicited "free" inspection of the roof or crawlspace will result in an unnecessary repair bill
- Make sure that you know the sender of an e-mail
