Other programs ENF funds include: Scholarships, Youth Activities, Veterans Ser vice, Elks Veterans Memorial maintenance, and much more. participates, will routinely yield positive and higher-level results for the Association and Order.

As a bit of background, as of March 31, 1991, our Association reached its high point in membership at 26,181 members. For the next 25 years, we lost 6,931 members reaching a low point of 19,250 members as of March 31, 2016. During those 25 years, that loss equated to a loss of about 26% of our members as opposed to a loss of over 50% for other Associations and our Order. Historically, the MD DE & DC Elks Association has done a better job with membership than the rest of the Order!!!

For the next four years after March 31, 2016, we once again were back on track, increasing our membership numbers. In the 2020/2021 year, COVID-19 caught up with us. Unfortunately, we experienced another major membership loss as of March 31, 2021, bringing us to a new low of 19,196 - hopefully the lowest membership number we will ever see as an Association!!

Well, this past year, in 2021/2022, the 37 Lodges of the MD DE & DC Elks Association turned that around and gave our Association a gain in membership (a 483-member increase! At least two things stand out about this accomplishment; First, a 483-member gain is the highest individual annual membership gain in 37 years since March 31, 1985. And second, 28 of our 37 Lodges achieved a growth in membership, the most significant number of Lodges to ever achieve a gain in a given year in the history of our Association. An outstanding effort, and thanks to all those Lodges and individual Elks that made those results possible for the 2021/2022 year – everything begins and ends at the Lodge level, and the efforts of the many caused great results for the Association!!

The membership numbers at this point for this 2022/2023 year look pretty similar to those of last year at this time, but with about 11% higher gains already posted. It seems pretty encouraging, but it will require all Lodges to keep their eye on the ball and diligently work the remaining seven months to attract new members, collect delinquent dues, and initiate! Once again, the more Lodges involved in the effort, the better the chances for overall success.

Each individual Lodge's ENF donations total what the Association accomplishes. Through July 31, 2022, we are ranked 7th of the 48 Associations of the Order with \$105,455.25 already donated by our 37 Lodges and a whopping 111.641% of the Grand Exalted Ruler goal (in just four months). Last year at the same time, we were 15th in Order and only at 80.387% of the GER's goal. We (our 37 Lodges) are on a record-setting pace of donating.

If the effort and level of giving continues for the remainder of the year, this could truly be a record-setting year for the Association and another example of the individual Lodges collectively causing high accomplishments for the Association.

The underlying message continues to be that the MD DE & DC Elks Association can excel in any and all programs, projects, and endeavors it pursues if a majority of our Lodges are engaged and seriously pursuing those same programs, projects, and endeavors.

Individually and collectively, we must get all our Lodges engaged in all Elk endeavors like they have been with Membership this past year - not limited to, but including Elks Camp Barrett, WJJMF, ENF, Hoop Shoot, Soccer Shoot, Drug Awareness, Veterans Service, Americanism, Government Relations, Public Relations, Ritual, etc., etc. We have the wherewithal as an Association (a group of 37 Lodges) to excel in these areas and lead the way for Elks everywhere, but that requires more, all of our Lodges being engaged and working the programs, etc. If your Lodge is not seriously engaged and working on all Elk programs, please work to get them more heavily involved, and if you can't make it happen yourself, request assistance from any level of State or District leadership. WE NEED EVERY MD DE & DC ELK, EVERY MD DE & DC LODGE ENGAGED IN ALL OUR MANY WORKS OF ELKDOM!!

At the upcoming Fall Conference in Ocean City (Sept 30 - Oct 2, 2022), we will be hosting the New Jersey Elks State President

Victoria "Vickie" Watson and her husband Les, as well as John Neetz, Area 2 member of the GL Auditing & Accounting Committee and his wife, Kelly. Please join Jane and me in extending a warm welcome to both couples, and be sure to let them know how you, your Lodge, and our Association are "Promoting Elkdom with Enthusiasm."

Also, John will conduct an Accounting/FRS Seminar on Saturday and will gladly work with any Lodge/Lodge Treasurer to address any accounting/FRS issues. Encourage your Treasurer to be there and participate in the Seminar.

Welcome, all, to the Fall conference. It is good to spend some time with our friends and Elk Family we see just a few times per year.

As I write this in late August, we are on track toward another successful membership year. We are recruiting new members and getting our delinquents back into the fold. Our delinquent percentage is about 11%; nationally, it is 12%, so we are above average here. This is a bit close for comfort; let's keep working on those delinquents.

Here are some numbers to consider as of late August. We started the year with 19,679 members; we currently have 20,386. Our delinquents are at 2,200; keep after them. We also have 391 candidates awaiting initiation. We need to move on these; let's not keep people waiting. Initiate, Initiate, Initiate, Initiate!!!

Grand Lodge has a goal for each State to add 10% of its starting number as new members. For MD, DE, & DC, that would mean adding 1,968 new members this year. We're just short of halfway through the Lodge year, and we have added 920. We are at 47% of that goal. Let's keep our momentum going. My report at this conference will have up-to-date numbers.

There is no substitute for an active membership committee. As the Grand Lodge Plus Membership program mentioned, we need our committee to be a "team." Lodge Secretaries, you can give "read" access to CLMS to your Lodge membership chairs, making it easier for them to stay current on who needs to be contacted. Membership committee folks should become familiar with the Membership and Marketing guides, which are part of the "members only" part of Elks.org.

We have a new resource available now, it's Join.Elks.Org. Prospective members can learn about our Order and apply online through this new site. One caution for Lodge Secretaries is that the site **does not collect the application fee**, so you will need to contact the applicants before processing the online applications.

Another new program available online is a photo opportunity. Get a group photo of the new members and email it to Rick Gathen (<u>rickg@elks.org</u>). He will send back a photo of the group digitally framed with a picture of our GER Bruce Hidley giving them a warm welcome. This photo is printable, can be sent to each new member, and can be included in your Lodge communications.

I have made many references to Elks.org, and all members can access this site; if it's your first visit, follow the instructions to register, and you'll be all set.

Initiations in September and October are called the "Grand Exalted Ruler's Class." You will see many

references to this class on social media and Elks' news sources throughout the fall. Let's see how many MD, DE, DC Lodges we can get into the class.

Congratulations are in order for our leaders in recruitment and initiations. Our current leaders are Cape Henlopen, Ocean City, and Salisbury. I will report on who leads the pack when we meet. Many Lodges are also getting reinstatements and transfers, easy additions as these folks are already Elks.
